

STUDENT ARRIVAL INFORMATION



MORNINGS BEFORE SCHOOL

Each family will be asked to complete a quick digital screening questionnaire for each student **BEFORE** coming to school each morning. This is for both car rider and bus rider students. This link will be sent out before school begins.

CAR LINE ARRIVAL

The car line will begin at 7:10 am. Students are to stay in the car until a staff member comes to the door. Each student will get a temperature check by a staff member. If the digital screening survey was not completed prior to arrival, screening questions will be asked at that time by the staff member.



CAR RIDER DELAYS



The car rider line will be delayed due to screening questions and temperature checks. Please be patient with our staff members and our families. This is new to everyone, and we want to ensure the safety of our car line staff and our students. Please follow the directions of our helpful staff members.

TEMPERATURE CHECKS

Each student will get a temperature check right at the car by a staff member using a no-touch thermometer placed close to the forehead. Our staff members will be wearing face coverings and gloves. Please talk to your child(ren) about this now to help prepare them for our new screening protocol. Students should also have on face coverings at this time.



IF THERE IS A TEMPERATURE

Any student with a temperature of 100 or greater will leave in the car with the adult that brought him/her to school. Staff members will go by the current reading on the school thermometer.

BUS RIDERS

Bus riders will be seated one student per seat (siblings may sit together). Bus riders will be required to have on a face covering prior to loading the bus. Bus riders will have the temperature check performed at the bus once it arrives on campus. Any student with a temperature of 100 or greater will not go to class, and will have to be picked up immediately by a parent.



HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

- Be positive and supportive of your school personnel as we carry out mandates beyond our control
