How Do I Log In?

Go to the Clever portal. Select the Achieve3000 icon. If necessary, select one of your classes and enter the platform.

When you enter the platform for the very first time, LevelSet will launch.

What is LevelSet?

LevelSet is the initial assessment that you must take to begin receiving information in Achieve3000 on your independent reading level. To be successful, read the directions carefully, then begin the assessment. Take your time and do your very best. This is what you will see:



Then What?

Once LevelSet is complete, you will transition into the Achieve3000 platform. Below is what the Home Page will look like.

At the very top of your Home Page, click the button that says, GO TO CAREER CENTER.

Your teacher will grade your Thought Question response, so do your very best to include facts and details from the Article in your response as evidence.
