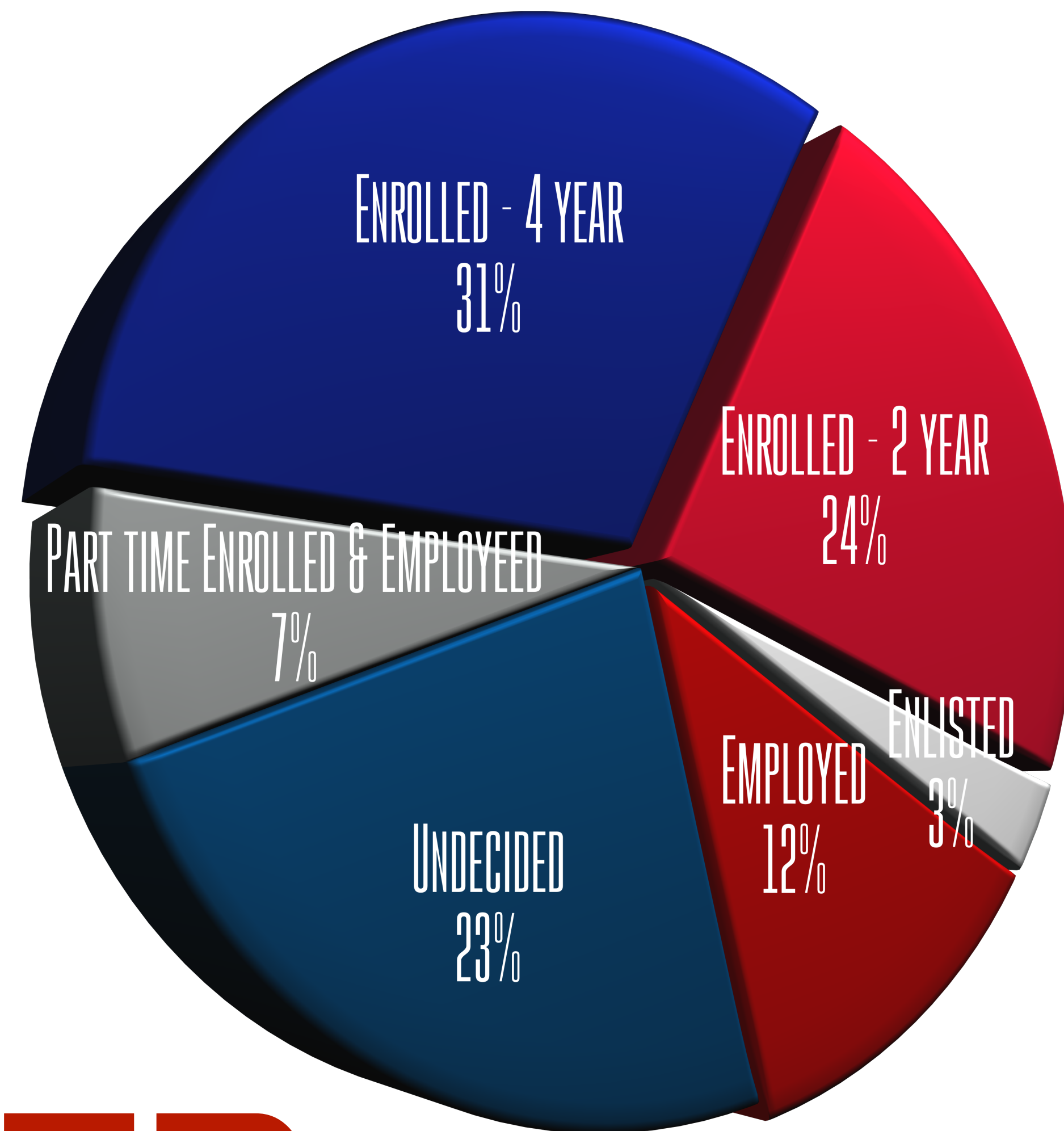

YOUR CLASS SCHEDULE MATTERS

Maintaining good academic standing is important to ensure all students graduate and are ready for next steps beyond high school. A total of 22 high school credits are required for graduation. Attendance is important for success, and contributes to a student's academic success. Our school counselors audit student transcripts, and advisory teachers assist with academic check-ins on a regular basis.



Graduation Requirements:

4 English, 4 Math, 4 History, 3 Science, 1 Health/PE, and the Freshman Seminar Class

2 of your elective classes have to be a combination of Art, World Language, ROTC, and/or CTE classes to total 22 credits.

Classes are offered on regular, honors, college and career promise (CCP), and Advanced Placement (AP) when available.

STUDENT DAILY ATTENDANCE & PERIOD ATTENDANCE

School attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. Regular school attendance promotes academic success. **Beginning fall semester 2024, your daily attendance (or non-attendance) in class affects your athletic eligibility for future semesters and also participation in extra-curricular activities and school privileges.**

- Students must be in attendance for 85% of the semester. You can not exceed 13 absences.
- Students must attend 50% of assigned classes on a given day to be marked present.
- Students must be present for at least 50% of the class in order to not be counted absent for the class.

KEEP IN MIND

- Students must be present 50% of their scheduled day for athletic participation. This applies to both practices and games.
- Mustang Advisory counts as a class for attendance and applies to the new attendance requirements.
- Students will not be allowed to sign out for lunch and leave campus. There is not enough time to leave campus and return within your assigned second period class.

Each week on Sunday evening, a connect ed message will be sent to all Mustang Families with upcoming important dates about events happenings around East. We hope you will join our events as they are an important component of our school culture, a part of being a Mustang! All parents are encouraged to become an observer in Canvas and check grades & attendance through Infinite Campus.

CONNECT WITH CLASS ON CANVAS

Parents can sign up as an observer in Canvas. Observers can link their Canvas account to their student's account so they can see assignment due dates, announcements, and other course content. Observers can view the course content but cannot participate in the course. Contact your student's teacher to get your pairing code to link your account to your student.

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

Scholastic Requirements:

- A student must pass 75% of classes in order to be eligible to participate in athletics.
- All student athletes should take a full class schedule, and maintain good academic standing in all classes.
- If a student is taking a RCCC course, he/she cannot drop the class if that will make the student have a load of less than 3 classes/semester and remain academically eligible.
- Fall eligibility is determined by spring grades. Incoming freshmen are excluded from this rule. Winter sports eligibility is determined by spring (of prior year, and you must remain eligible at the conclusion of fall semester). Spring eligibility is determined by fall semester.

Notice - New Policy from NCHSA

Students must have been in daily attendance* 85 percent (no more than 13 days absences) of the previous semester beginning January 1, 2025. (First semester will determine attendance eligibility for second semester and second semester will determine attendance eligibility for first semester.)

*You must attend 50% or more of your classes to be counted present for the school day.

All athletes must also have a current pre-participation physical evaluation, PPE (signed by a medical doctor), on file and complete all participation forms in FinalForms. See your coach or athletic directors, Mrs. Britschge or Mr. Hightower for more info.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Student attire should promote a safe and orderly classroom learning environment. It should be appropriate for the school setting. If a student is not following the dress code guidelines, then he/she will receive a dress code violation. The Dress Code violation includes wearing, decorating or adorning clothing that is inappropriate to the learning process. Clothing that reveals undergarments, chest, breasts, navel, buttocks, or any private body part will be considered inappropriate for the school setting. Any article that displays, suggests, promotes, or reveals a lewd, vulgar, unsafe, violent or sexual message through language, images and/or symbols is prohibited.

The following are NOT allowed at any time:

- Sunglasses in the school building or classrooms.
- Sagging pants; as such, undergarments are not to be seen.
- Clothing or hats with inappropriate, suggestive, language or pictures, to include drugs, alcohol, or tobacco.
- Bandanas, may not be displayed at any time.

The following dress code guidelines must be followed:

- If wearing leggings or yoga pants, the top/skirt/dress should completely cover the waistband.
- Shoulders must be covered if wearing a tank top.
- No mesh or see through shirts that expose the torso unless an appropriate shirt is underneath.
- Hoodies may be worn in the “up” position, but not with a hat throughout the building. Hats may be worn throughout the building. Students must ensure face is visible at all times.
- Shorts, dresses, and skirts should be school appropriate length and approximately mid-thigh.
- Clothing with holes or rips that show skin or undergarments should not have rips or holes that exceed mid-thigh on pants, shorts or skirts.

RSS OPT OUT FORM

A part of building our school culture is promoting students through internal announcements and also social media. Yearbook staff members, teachers, administrators, and other staff are frequently taking pictures throughout the school that may be used.

IF you do not want photographs of your child shared, or other information, you must submit an OPT OUT form to the main office. If you need a hard copy provided, please let Mrs. Clark in the main office know and one will be sent home.



STUDENT DIRECTORY LIMITATION (OPT OUT) FORM

TO BE FILED IN THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE

No action is necessary unless you want information for your child withheld.

According to the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), directory information about students may be released by Rowan-Salisbury Schools without parental consent, provided annual notification has been given and the school does not have on file written denial to release directory information. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow RSS to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school and district publications. Examples of general directory information are:

name	date of graduation, degrees and awards
age	dates of attendance
participation in officially recognized activities and sports	most recent previous school attended
weight and height of athletes	programs / school yearbook (photos)
enrollment status	grade level
parent's / guardian's name	date of graduation, degrees and awards
student's photograph, pictures or videos taken on buses, school grounds, in school buildings and at school activities unless the picture or video may reveal confidential information about a student	dates of attendance

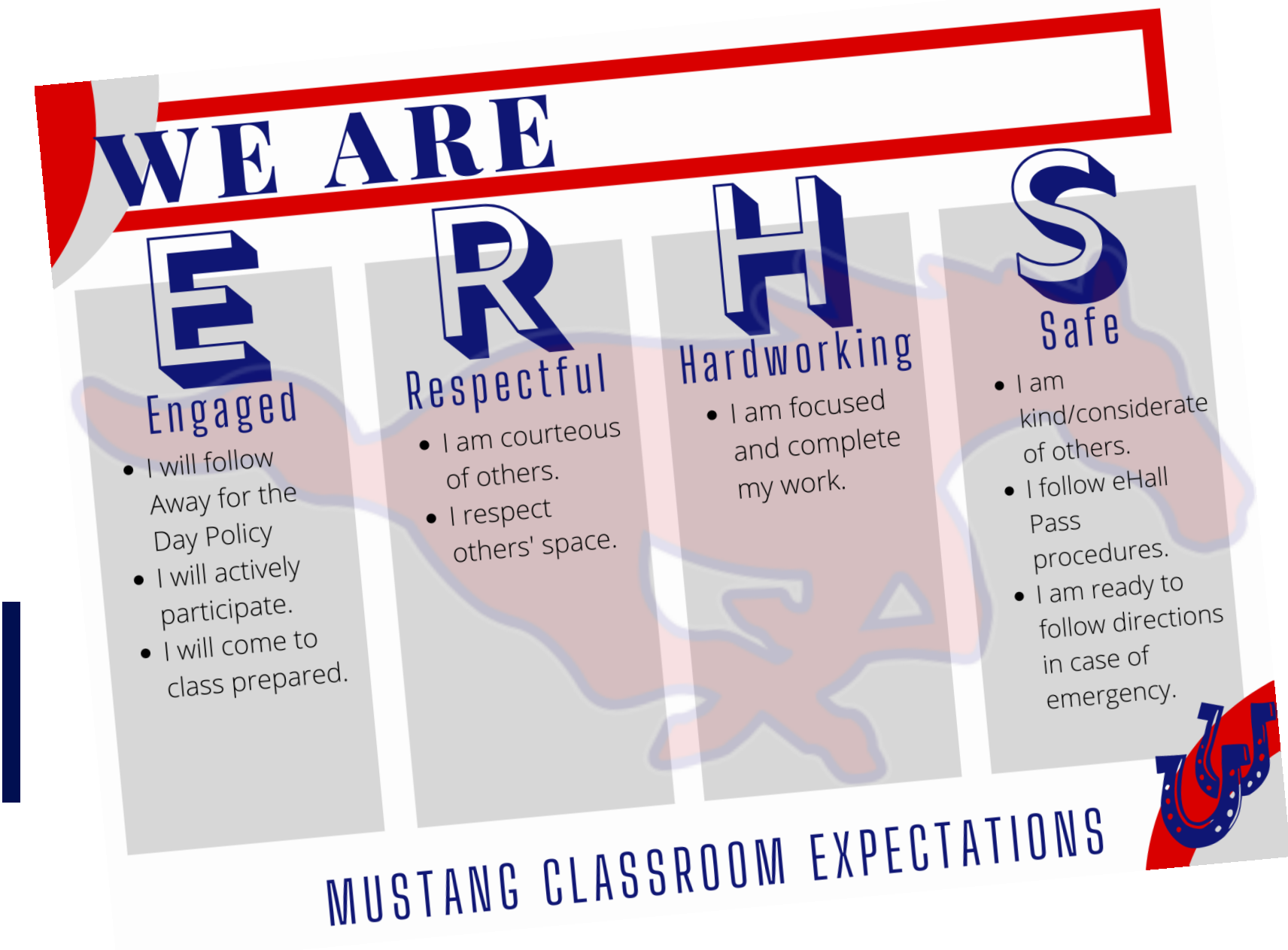

PARKING PRIVILEGES

Parking on East Rowan's campus is considered a privilege for students. Each student who drives must buy his/her own parking permit. Students may not share a permit. Neither ERHS or RSS assumes any responsibility for damages to private vehicles brought onto campus. All student drivers must be licensed and have appropriate auto insurance. The administration reserves the right to terminate parking privileges and/or tow any vehicle for cause. For the safety and security of the school, all vehicles are subject to search whenever a school official has reasonable suspicion to believe illegal or unauthorized items may be located inside the automobiles. Parking permits may be purchased from the front office before or after school, or during lunch, but not during class time. Parking spaces will be sold in priority order (seniors, juniors, sophomores, freshmen) as parking is limited and not everyone is guaranteed a parking space. Seniors can paint parking spaces with prior approval.

RESPONSIBLE USE TECH POLICY

The Responsible Use Policy has many conditions or facets of being a responsible Digital Citizen. The intended audience of this agreement is for Rowan-Salisbury Schools' students.

1. **Respect Yourself.** I will show respect for myself through my actions. I will select online names that are appropriate. I will demonstrate respect for myself and for others when posting information and images online, including personal information about my life, experiences, experimentation or relationships. I will not be obscene.
2. **Protect Yourself.** I will ensure that the information, images and materials I post online will not put me at risk. I will not publish my personal details, contact details or a schedule of my activities. I will report any attacks or inappropriate behavior directed at me. I will protect passwords, accounts and resources.
3. **Respect Others.** I will show respect to others. I will not use electronic mediums to bully, harass or stalk other people. I will show respect for other people in my choice of websites. I will not visit sites that are degrading, pornographic, racist or inappropriate. I will not abuse my rights of access and I will not enter other people's private spaces or areas.
4. **Protect Others.** I will protect others by reporting abuse, not forwarding inappropriate materials or communications, and not visiting sites that are degrading, pornographic, racist or inappropriate.
5. **Respect Intellectual property.** I will request permission to use resources. I will suitably cite any and all use of websites, books, media, etc. I will validate information. I will use and abide by the fair use rules. Use of AI (Artificial Intelligence) programs or applications are only allowed based on teacher direction. Use of AI or AI tools to complete assignments when teacher has prohibited will result in a misuse of technology and honor code violation write-up.
6. **Protect Intellectual Property.** I will request to use the software and media others produce. I will use free and open source alternatives rather than pirating software. I will purchase, license and register all software. I will purchase my music and media, and refrain from distributing these in a manner that violates their licenses. I will act with integrity.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

A safe learning environment for **ALL** students is the number one priority our staff.

- Monthly fire drills, earthquake drill, and tornado drill. We practice these drills so that we are ready in the event of an emergency.
- Lock down drills will be practiced quarterly. As families, you will be notified immediately when we have a lockdown drill. You are asked not to call the school immediately, as were it a real emergency, we would not be able to assist you in the moment. Listen carefully to connect-ed messages sent during school hours. These are often regarding safety issues, and we relay information as soon as we can.
- We will have two monthly random metal detector searches. A random process is used to determine which rooms are selected for the metal detector search. All families will be notified after a random metal detector search is conducted on campus.

SAFETY GUIDELINES

A safe learning environment for **ALL** students is the number one priority our staff.

- We will continue this year with our cell phone policy of **Away for the Day**. Students are not to have phones out in classrooms. Phones will be allowed before/after school, during class change, and at lunch. They need to be out of sight and not cause a distraction to instruction. - **Hall Passes** will continue to be used. If students are in the hall, they must have a pass from their classroom teacher. This allows administrators/employees to track students in/out of class. Use will be monitored and limited if school personnel sees patterns of behavior that are not related to academics and a safe school. Students may be asked to show the pass to any adult in the school to ensure students are in the correct part of the building.
- **Students leaving campus without permission** during the school day will have parking privileges revoked in addition to disciplinary action. This poses a real risk to the safety of our students when they are leaving campus throughout the school day. All students leaving early/arriving late must use the main entrance of the school.
- Disciplinary action, including OSS, may result for **propping doors open** and letting students/any other person in locked entrances during the school day. This can result in unwanted visitors on our campus and is a huge safety risk. Patrols will be made on a regular basis to ensure locked exterior doors and gates.

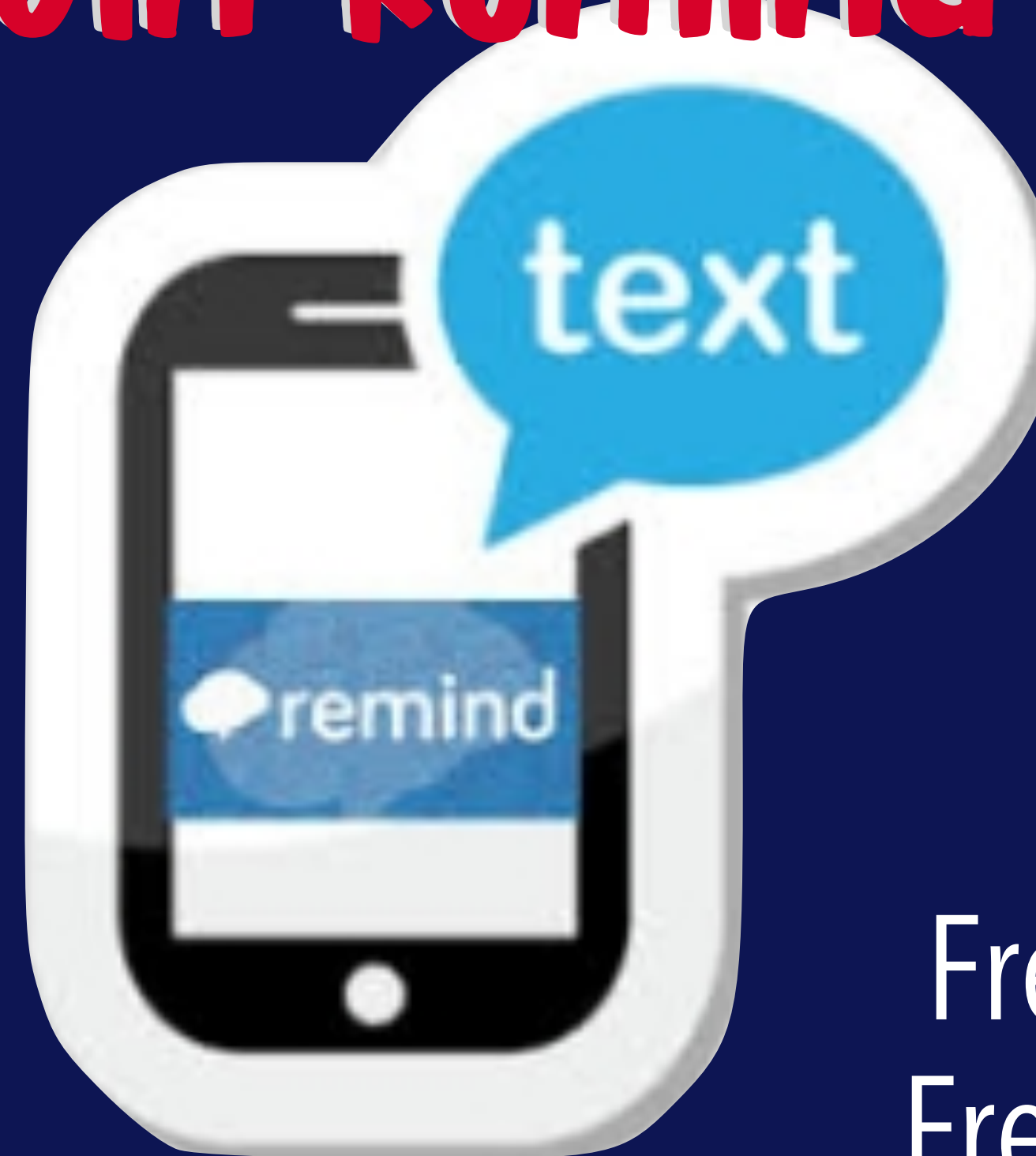
