



One constant is interwoven throughout all versions of our renewal plan, and that is students are at the center of the decision making and opportunities. Our academic classes provide a great foundation for all students regardless of next steps. Our advisory time each day provides students with a time to interact and work on interpersonal skills, while ExpERience East days allow students to pursue their unique life goals.

Graduation Requirements:

4 English, 4 Math, 4 History, 3 Science, 1 Health/PE, and the Freshman Seminar Class 2 of your elective classes have to be a combination of Art, World Language, ROTC, and/or CTE classes to total 22 credits.

Classes are offered on regular, honors, college and career promise (CCP), and Advanced Placement (AP) when available.

MUSTANG ADVISORY

Mustang Advisory is Mustang Round-Up/EmpowER revised and renewed for our students and school. The allotted time in our schedule remains, as the purpose behind an advisory period is centered around our core value of relationships and academic success. Why advisory? The broad purpose of a specific time set aside within a school schedule for an advisory period is to ensure at least one adult gets to know each student well, and ensures learning needs are being met, while also offering encouragement and helping them plan for their future. This is a key time for discussing important issues and to empower students to become invested in doing their part to create a strong, healthy and flourishing school culture in which all students can thrive. Students are the heart of East Rowan, and advisory is a time each day for student to unite togethER for common purpose. Students must attend advisory each day (unless prior approval for early release/late arrival).

CLASS OFFERINGS AND SUPPORT SERVICES


- All graduation requirements will be offered as needed
- Electives may/may not be offered depending on availability and the nature of the course. Some classes are not for virtual (ie. masonry, nursing fundamentals)
- Classes will be taught by ERHS teachers and a combination of computer programs such as NCVPS and Edmentum (not a computer program except when necessary)
- Honors/Regular classes will be combined and differentiated work provided for students
- All EC/ESL/504 services will be provided as documented on student plans

VIRTUAL LEARNING ASYNCHRONOUS VS. SYNCHRONOUS

VIRTUAL ASSIGNMENTS AND MATERIALS

- Assignments will be a variety of items
- •If you find it in a face to face class, you will find it in a virtual class
- •Course materials will be posted in Canvas and released in modules for students to work at their own pace
- You are expected to stay on schedule with assignments
- •Your teacher will contact counselors and parents if you are not meeting expectations to stay on pace.
- •It is highly recommended that you set a daily schedule and follow to meet deadlines and stay on pace.



WIRTUAL DAILY SCHEDULE

TYPICAL CLASS

- Each class will have learning materials provided and assignments will be released on a schedule through learning modules as set by the teacher
- Each class will have real-time class meetings, help sessions/office hours, and independent work
- •Work load will be similar to face to face classes, but most students report larger work load due to amount of independent work

ATTENDANCE IS EXPECTED

- Each class will offer weekly synchronous sessions on multiple days/times
- You are expected to attend at least two synchronous sessions per class per week
- Majority of your work will be performed asynchronously and on your personal schedule





Scholastic Requirements:

- •A student must pass 75% of classes in order to be eligible to participate in athletics.
- All student athletes should take a full class schedule, and maintain good academic standing in all classes.
- •If a student is taking a RCCC course, they cannot drop the class if that will make the student have a load of less than 3 or 4classes/semester and remain academically eligible.
- •Fall eligibility is determined by spring grades. Rising freshman are excluded from this rule. Winter sports eligibility is determined by spring (of prior year, and you must remain eligible at the conclusion of fall semester). Spring eligibility is determined by fall semester.

All athletes must also have a current pre-participation physical evaluation, PPE (signed by a medial doctor), on file and complete all participation forms in DragonFly. See your coach or athletic director, Mr. Andrews for more info.



ERHS Rules & Guidelines



ERHS student dress code is directly aligned with the Rowan-Salisbury Schools dress code policy. If a student is not following the dress code guidelines, then he/she will receive a dress code violation. The Dress Code violation includes wearing, decorating or adorning clothing that is inappropriate to the learning process. Daily clothing should be appropriate for the learning environment. Clothing that reveals undergarments, chest, breasts, navel, buttocks, or any private body part will be considered inappropriate for the school setting. Any article that displays, suggests, promotes, or reveals a lewd, vulgar, unsafe, violent or sexual message through language, images and/or symbols is prohibited. Pajamas, slippers, etc., should not be worn to school.

- Shorts, dresses, and skirts should be school appropriate length and approximately mid-thigh.
- Clothing with holes or rips that show skin or undergarments should not have rips or holes that exceed mid-thigh on pants, shorts or skirts.
- Sagging pants; as such, undergarments are not to be seen.
- Clothing with inappropriate, suggestive, language or pictures, to include drugs, alcohol, or tobacco are NOT to be worn.
- Bandanas, may not be displayed at any time.

- If wearing leggings or yoga pants, the top/skirt/dress should completely cover the waistband.
- Shoulders must be covered if wearing a tank top.
- No mesh or see through shirts that expose the torso unless an appropriate shirt is underneath.
- Hoodies may not be worn in the "up" position throughout the building.
- Hats are NOT to be worn in the building.
- No pajama pants or loungewear worn as everyday wear shall be worn in school.

RSSOPTOUTFORM

A part of building our school culture is promoting students through internal announcements and also social media. Yearbook staff members, teachers, administrators, and other staff are frequently taking pictures throughout the school that may be used.





PARING PRIVILES

Parking on East Rowan's campus is considered a privilege for students. Each student who drives must buy his/her own parking permit. Students may not share a permit. Neither ERHS or RSS assumes any responsibility for damages to private vehicles brought onto campus. All student drivers must be licensed and have appropriate auto insurance. The administration reserves the right to terminate parking privileges and/or tow any vehicle for cause. For the safety and security of the school, all vehicles are subject to search whenever a school official has reasonable suspicion to believe illegal or unauthorized items may be located inside the automobiles. Parking permits may be purchased from the front office before or after school, or during lunch, but not during class time. Parking spaces will be sold in priority order (seniors, juniors, sophomores, freshmen) as parking is limited and not everyone is guaranteed a parking space. Seniors can paint parking spaces with prior approval.

PARKING PRIVILES

Operating a motor vehicle is one of the greatest responsibilities of adulthood. With just a moment's slip, lives can be ruined or ended. It's everyone's job to drive in a manner that ensures that students arrive at school safely and park their vehicles in an orderly way. The policies on this flyer describe how East Rowan High School will work to see that students operate cars on campus safely.

RULES

- You must have a license.
- •Only Students who are at least 16 years old and have a valid Operator's License may purchase a parking permit. No permits will be sold to students with Learner's Permits.
- Permits are not transferrable and non-refundable.
- •Students may purchase and use only one parking permit. Permits cannot be sold, given, or transferred to another student. Students who withdraw from East Rowan High School must turn in their parking permit. NO REFUNDS ARE GIVEN!

Our parking is limited. East Rowan High School cannot guarantee that every student who wants a parking space can have one. Permits will be sold first to rising seniors, then to rising juniors, then on a "first-come-first-served" basis. Students who wish to buy a permit after they are "sold out" will be put on a waiting list and contacted when a spot becomes available.

RESPONSIBLE USE TECH POLICY

The Responsible Use Policy has many conditions or facets of being a responsible Digital Citizen. The intended audience of this agreement is for Rowan-Salisbury Schools' students.

- 1. **Respect Yourself.** I will show respect for myself through my actions. I will select online names that are appropriate. I will demonstrate respect for myself and for others when posting information and images online, including personal information about my life, experiences, experimentation or relationships. I will not be obscene.
- 2. **Protect Yourself.** I will ensure that the information, images and materials I post online will not put me at risk. I will not publish my personal details, contact details or a schedule of my activities. I will report any attacks or inappropriate behavior directed at me. I will protect passwords, accounts and resources.
- 3. **Respect Others.** I will show respect to others. I will not use electronic mediums to bully, harass or stalk other people. I will show respect for other people in my choice of websites. I will not visit sites that are degrading, pornographic, racist or inappropriate. I will not abuse my rights of access and I will not enter other people's private spaces or areas.
- 4. **Protect Others.** I will protect others by reporting abuse, not forwarding inappropriate materials or communications, and not visiting sites that are degrading, pornographic, racist or inappropriate.
- 5. **Respect Intellectual property.** I will request permission to use resources. I will suitably cite any and all use of websites, books, media, etc. I will validate information. I will use and abide by the fair use rules.
- 6. **Protect Intellectual Property.** I will request to use the software and media others produce. I will use free and open source alternatives rather than pirating software. I will purchase, license and register all software. I will purchase my music and media, and refrain from distributing these in a manner that violates their licenses. I will act with integrity.

SAFETY GUIDELINES & INCREASED SECURITY MEASURES

A safe learning environment for **ALL** students is the number one priority our staff.

STAUME THE SAME

Monthly fire drills, yearly lockdown drill, earthquake drill, and tornado drill. We practice these drills so that we are ready in the event of an emergency.

- We will continue this year with our cell phone policy of **Away for the Day**. Students are not to have phones out in classrooms. Phones will be allowed before/after school, during class change, and at lunch. For our new Mustang families, cell phones are not allowed in the classrooms. They need to be out of sight. For more information and research about the benefits to limiting cell phones in classrooms, visit https://www.awayfortheday.org/.
- **eHall Pass** will continue to be used. If students are in the hall they must have an eHall pass. This allows us to track students in/out of class. Use will be monitored and limited if we see patterns of behavior that are not related to academics and a safe school.
- **No hoods** should be worn in the building. Wearing a hood within the building makes it more difficult to monitor our security cameras when needed.

SAFETY GUIDELINES & INCREASED SECURITY MEASURES

A safe learning environment for **ALL** students is the number one priority our staff.

- Lock down drills will be practiced quarterly. As families you will be notified immediately when we have a lockdown drill. You are asked not to call the school immediately, as were it a real emergency, we would not be able to assist you in the moment. Listen carefully to connect ed messages sent during school hours. These are often regarding safety issues, and we relay information as soon as we can.
 - **No hats** are allowed to be worn in the building. Hats pose a similar safety risk as hoods. They make surveillance on our security cameras more difficult.
 - **Students leaving campus without permission** during the school day will have parking privileges revoked in addition to disciplinary action. This poses a real risk to the safety of our students when they are leaving campus throughout the school day. All students leaving early/arriving late must use the main entrance of the school.
 - •Disciplinary action, including OSS, may result for **propping doors open** and letting students in locked entrances during the school day. This can result in unwanted visitors on our campus and is a huge safety risk. Patrols will be made on a regular basis to ensure locked exterior doors and gates.


